ORV Trail, motorcycle-only. Sandy and whooped in generally open or pine forests. North/northwestern portion very rocky (no sand, just rocks). Connects to Newberry trail. Modern staging area. Located in Chippewa and Mackinac counties which allow ORVs on county roads. Forest roads generally open as well.

Bull Gap......Pg# 20-21 <u>Width: 50" Length: 74.4 Traffic: More County Rds: Some Forest Rds: No</u> ORV Trail, generally wider. Sandy and whooped to the north, rocky and hardpacked to the south. Varies from flat/open to tight/hilly. Several loop options. Includes hill climb/scramble area "Bull Gap Hill". Connects to Meadows ORV trail. Connects to Pink Store on M-33 for food/fuel. Connects to Mio for food/fuel/motel access. Connects to Mack Lake campground. Several staging areas, the one on M-33 is modern. Located in Oscoda and Ogemaw counties. Southwest portion of the trail is in Ogemaw county which has opened it's roads to ORVs but Oscoda county has not.
